PRACTICE WEARING FACE COVERINGS

Students should begin to practice wearing their face coverings for extended periods of time. This will help make the transition back to school easier for them.

DAILY ROUTINE HEALTH ASSESSMENT

The normal morning routine typically includes a shower, getting dressed and eating breakfast. It is important
that every morning, students be assessed to make sure they are not showing symptoms of Covid prior to
departing for school. Students should stay home if they answer yes to any of the questions below.
Do you have a temperature above 100°F?
Do you have a headache?
Do you have a sore throat?
Do you have a persistent cough?
Do you have difficulty breathing?
Do you have a loss of smell or taste?
Do you have digestive issues?
Are you waiting for a Covid-19 test result?
Have you been recently exposed to someone who has tested positive for Covid-19?
Symptoms explained as "allergies" or "asthma" need to be accompanied with a doctor's note if the student is to

attend school. When in doubt, please consider the health and safety of the other students and staff in the

building and keep your student home. Contact the LHS attendance office if your student will be absent.

HOW DO I GET MY SCHEDULE?

During the week of August 10th, students will have their schedules emailed to them, and families will also be able to access schedules through Progressbook. **9th grade students** will receive their class schedules during Freshman Focus on August 10th and 11th (click here for more Freshman Focus details). ALL students will receive a new and finalized copy of their schedule on Monday, August 17th when they report to TEAM (homeroom) first thing in the morning.

NEW STUDENT? NEED A SCHEDULE?

If you are a new student to Lebanon High School and have not yet been scheduled, please contact Mrs. Chapman in the Guidance Office @ 934-5106 to schedule an appointment with your counselor. The Guidance Office will reopen on August 3rd. We'd like to welcome Ms. Loren Wall to the counseling office who will serve students with last names beginning with E-K. Additionally, after making some adjustments for our counselors' caseloads, counselors will work with the following students: Ms. Fugate (A-D), Ms. Wall (E-K), Mr. Tipton (L-Ri) and Mr. Schneider (Rj-Z).

SCHOOL FEES

School fees are assigned to students based on the classes for which they are enrolled. Prior to September 4th, all students must have fees paid in full or a payment plan in place. A payment plan may be discussed with Ms. Flannery or a grade level administrator. In an effort to continue to collect unpaid fees, we will not sell Homecoming tickets to a student until fees are paid or there is a payment plan in place. Fees can be paid on-line through EZ Pay beginning the week of <u>August 10th</u>. This is the preferred method of payment and credit card convenience fees will not be applied.

FRESHMAN FOCUS: AUGUST 10-11, 2019

Freshman Focus is two, **optional** action packed days on Monday, August 10 & Tuesday, August 11. Over the two day orientation, students will participate in team building activities, meet other incoming freshmen (and their upperclassmen student mentors), and learn the ins and outs of being an LHS student! Specifically, on Day 1, students will receive their class schedules, locker assignments, and tour the building. We will share a link for our parents with messages from student leaders, the high school principal, and Chris Bowers, our FF host. On Day 2, students will visit an activity fair, practice walking through their schedule, continue team building and practice going through the lunch line. *Students must bring their lunch or purchase lunch in the food court. BUS RIDERS

Students and families will be able to access their bus schedules AFTER August 4, 2020.

- 1. Visit www.lebanonschools.org/departments/transportation-12/bus-routes-50
- 2. Use your student's ID number (lunch code) as the user name and birthdate (Six digits-MMDDYY) as the password.
- 3. When logging in for the first time, you will be prompted to reset your password.
- 4. Click on Work with Students.
- 5. Click on View My Students.
- 6. Your student's name will appear, click on it to view your student's bus information
- 7. If you have any further questions, you can email the transportation department at schoolbus@lebanonschools.org.

STUDENT PARKING

We utilize our Ticket Tracker online system to place parking permit orders for any LHS students holding a VALID Driver's License. Students with temporary licenses are not eligible for parking permits. Please read the rules and regulations section carefully. Students not following rules and regulations may lose parking privileges temporarily or permanently. **NOTE: Students running to their cars in the building or in the lot in an effort to beat the buses will lose parking privileges.**

To order your Parking Permit, Use this <u>link</u> and pay online before August 10th. Once the form is completed and you have paid, you may come to the LHS Main Office to pick up the physical permit from Mrs. Hoyt. **YOU MUST BRING YOUR DRIVER'S LICENSE WHEN YOU PICK UP YOUR PERMIT!** After August 10th, you will only be able to purchase parking passes at the fronts desk with cash or check.

TRAFFIC

Please be patient with the traffic if you are dropping off or picking up your child from school. There are a lot of vehicles coming and going each day, so here are a few points (and videos) to help keep traffic moving:

- **Student parkers** When arriving, please note the **20 mph** speed limit signs and drive with caution. **Doors will open at 6:45.** When leaving, you must use the front entrance and stay out of the bus lot.
- Parents dropping off (AM) <u>Do not use the front parking lot or stop in front of the building.</u> Follow the arrows and pull around to the left side of the building and drop off your child in the drop off zone (between the signs). Please have your student exit the car quickly and then you can follow the white arrows to exit the bottom of the parking lot. **Doors will open at 6:45.**
- Parents picking up (PM) <u>Do not use the front lot or park along the drop-off drive</u>. Please pull into the student lot (by veering left at the Y) and find a parking space. Please do not drive through cones, barriers, or chains. Traffic will be stopped once the buses begin leaving the lot around 2:38, so you may have a 15-20 minute wait until all buses are off of the lot.
- **Visitor Parking** Visitors will be extremely limited and in most cases for emergencies only. If there is an emergency, there are many 30 minute parking spots in front (main office/nurse) and side (attendance) of the building.
- Student Pick-up During School and/or Early Dismissal If you need to sign your child out early, please park in the visitor spots at the side of the building near the student entrance. This is where the attendance office is located.

Please follow all of these guidelines and follow directions to those directing traffic to ensure a safe and quick loading and unloading zone. Thank you for your patience and help with this!

ACADEMIC HONORS DIPLOMA

To receive an Academic Honors Diploma, students need to fulfill <u>all but one</u> of the following (in addition to the minimum graduation requirements): 4 math credits (algebra I, geometry, algebra II, plus higher level course), 4 science credits (including 2 units of advanced), 4 social studies credits, 3 world language credits (3 of one language, or 2 of two different languages), 1 fine art credit, 3.5 GPA (on 4.0 scale), and 27 ACT/1280 SAT. There are other Honors Diplomas available as well: Career Tech, STEM, Arts, and Social Science/Civic Engagement. Each one is slightly different than the other with more of a focus in a particular area. See your counselor for more details...what a great goal for students to shoot for!

PICTURE DAY: SEPTEMBER 3

All students will have their pictures taken on Thursday, September 3 to be used for student id's and our student information system. Please remember to dress well for pictures! Retakes are scheduled for Tuesday, November 3. *Seniors will also have an additional Formal Senior Composite Picture Day on January 8 if they missed the summer sessions. For seniors to be included in the composite, they must have a formal sitting with Lifetouch (Prestige) either over the summer or on January 8. See link for additional information. END-OF-COURSE TESTING

In addition to earning 20 credits through their regular coursework, students are also required to meet other state mandated testing requirements in order to earn their high school diploma. The Classes of 2021 and 2022 must accumulate 18 graduation points through testing. Of those 18 points, 4 of them must be in math, 4 must be in English, and 6 must be in science/social studies. Graduation points are earned by taking seven end-of-course tests in algebra I, geometry, English I, English II, biology, US history, and government. For the Classes of 2023 and later, students must demonstrate competency (through testing) AND demonstrate readiness through earning seals. Because there was no testing this past Spring due to COVID-19, all students were awarded the number of testing points based on the letter grade they earned in the corresponding class. We have been busy updating each student point totals and plan to share all of this information at various times throughout the year. TECHNOLOGY

As technology becomes more and more inclusive in our everyday lives, Lebanon City Schools has embraced and supported a 1-1 implementation at many of our buildings, including Lebanon High School. All students in grades 10, 11, and 12 already have a school issued Chromebook and charger. **PLEASE MAKE SURE YOU CHARGE YOUR CHROMEBOOK NOW TO MAKE SURE IT IS WORKING.** 9th grade students will receive their Chromebook and charger during the first week of school. Teachers have been continuing their work on lesson/assessment enhancements by utilizing this technology. All students at LHS are expected to bring it to class on a daily basis.

FROM THE NURSE'S OFFICE - SENIORS

The Ohio Department of Health requires immunization with the Meningococcal (MCV4) vaccine **before entry to 12**th **grade**. Your student may have already received one dose of this vaccine, but a second dose must be administered on or after the 16th birthday. If the first dose of meningococcal (MCV4) vaccine was administered after the 16th birthday, a second dose is not required. If your student has not had these immunizations, please make arrangements for them to receive these as soon as possible. **Proof of immunization or opt-out must be provided to the nursing office by September 3, 2020, or by Ohio law, your student will be excluded from school.** Per Ohio Revised Code and school board policy, a student may also be exempted from immunization if a parent or guardian objects for good cause, including religious conviction. SPECIAL POINTS OF INTEREST...

- SCHOOL DAY: School now starts each day at 7:15 and ends at 2:25
- **DOORS OPEN:** Doors to the building open at 6:45 unless you are with a teacher.
- **SCHEDULES:** All students will report to **TEAM** prior to 1st period the first few days of school. Every student will receive a **finalized** schedule during this time.
- Students will discuss and receive the handbook, agenda, and code of conduct and sign off that they have received them.
